

Don't Wait for Castro to Visit You ... Spend Summer 2003 in Cuba



Travel with other students to Havana, Cuba in the summer of 2003. Working with the trip's Cuban sponsor, UNEAC (The Union of Cuban Artists and Writers), students will learn about current Cuban politics and culture through a combination of lectures, readings, performances, and field trip experiences. The trip leader, Dr. Renee Scherlen, is a political scientist with expertise in Latin America. Last year she led a group of students to Cuba.

The trip will introduce students to the many unique aspects of Cuban politics and society. The political science class incorporates current events, history, political economy, and political theory. In the IDS course, the professor and various Cuban artists and scholars will lead students

in an exploration of five different aspects of Cuban culture (film, fine arts, music, literature, and dance) during the four weeks in Cuba. Both classes will draw upon field trips, museums, and other experiences to supplement the courses. Students are required to register for both courses.
